





The Program in Art and Design (Bachelor of Fine Arts) prepares students for innovative roles in the contemporary art world, including careers as professional artists, advanced study at the graduate level, and other career options created by a liberal arts education. The program begins with a series of foundation courses stressing the development of technical, problem-solving and conceptual skills. Each student's growth and development are achieved through exposure to multiple media, concluding with the production of a professional portfolio in an area of specialization.

Prerequisites. COM 200, ENG 112 or EHS 120, MTH 112.

Requirements. Completion of 124 credit hours as follows:

- A. All UM-Flint graduation requirements, including College of Arts and Sciences (CAS) General Education requirements and UM-Flint graduation requirements.
- B. Art history and theory (15 credits).
ARTH 111, ARH 112, ARH 403, ARH 411, ART 160.
- C. Foundations (19 credits).
ART 126, ART 130, ART 131, ART 141, ART 142.
- D. Design core (12 credits).
ART 252, ART 324, ART 342, ART 376.
- E. Areas of specialization (18 credits).
Courses in one or more of the following areas of emphasis, or additional ART courses at the 200 level or higher, approved by the advisor.
 1. *Graphic design:* form, content, type and image in the service of visual communication. ART 232, ART 330, ART 335; at least 9 credits chosen in consultation with the advisor.
 2. *Media design:* images, sequences and narratives formed by camera, lens and screen-based technologies. ART 302, ART 302, ART 320; at least 9 credits chosen in consultation with the advisor.
 3. *Interaction design:* cross-disciplinary practices connected to interactive media considering the virtual and physical. ART 335, ART 346, ART 348; at least 9 credits chosen in consultation with the advisor.

Actuarial Mathematics Program (BS)	
Mathematics Department information	
This program is designated as an "Undergraduate-Introductory" actuarial science program by the Society of Actuaries. It is designed for the student who wishes to pursue a career as an actuary, a career which requires strong mathematical skills as well as training in business-related areas. Actuaries work for insurance companies, financial planning agencies, governmental agencies, and other organizations to assist them in planning for the future using statistical and other mathematical techniques.	
Actuaries advance in their careers by passing examinations offered by the two American actuarial societies, the Society of Actuaries and the Casualty Actuarial Society. The courses required for this degree cover much of the material on the first two examinations of these two organizations. It is often possible for students to take an examination prior to graduation.	
Requirements. Completion of 124 credits, including:	
A. MTH 121, MTH 122, MTH 200, MTH 220, MTH 222 (18 credits).	
B. MTH 372, MTH 374 or MTH 377, MTH 375, MTH 378, MTH 380, MTH 393, MTH 402, and at least one other MTH course numbered 300 or higher, excluding MTH 390, MTH 391, MTH 395 (22-23 credits).	
C. ACC 201, ACC 202, FIN 361 (9 credits).	
D. CSC 175 and any necessary prerequisites.	
E. ECN 201, ECN 202, ECN 315, ECN 354 (12 credits).	
F. Also recommended: FIN 363, FIN 463; knowledge of Excel; a minor in Computer Science or Business (Finance).	
G. All requirements of the College of Arts and Sciences (CAS) Bachelor of Science degree, including General Education requirements, and all University of Michigan-Flint graduation requirements.

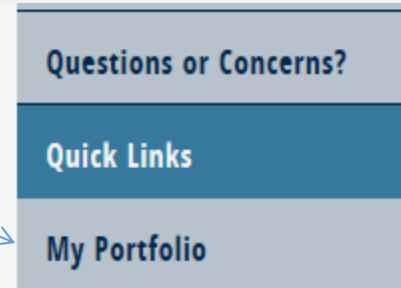
